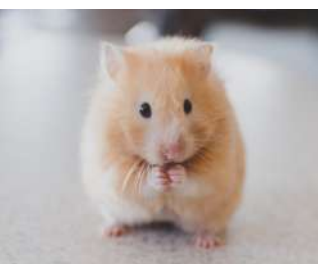
The **American robin** has orange feathers on its chest, brown feathers on its back and a yellow beak. They eat berries and insects. They are early starters, laying eggs early in spring and babies flying after two weeks.



This **white tailed deer** is a shy animal and when scared, run and wave their tails. Males regrow antlers every spring and use them to fight other male deer during the mating season.



Walruses live in the Arctic circle and are known by their big tusks. They are not deep divers and prefer to hunt for food in shallow waters. They eat various different sea creatures like shrimps and crabs.



The **mouse** is usually nocturnal, which means it sleeps during the day. Thanks to their big ears they have very good hearing. Mice are herbivores that eat all kinds of fruit and grains.



Donkeys are related to horses and zebras. A male **donkey** is called a 'jack' and a female donkey is called a 'jenny'. Most donkeys in North America are tame but there are wild donkeys in Arizona, Nevada, Texas and Mississippi.

Diet:

Snowy owls feed on a wide variety of small mammals like mice and rabbits. They don't chew but swallow their prey whole and digest them with strong stomach acid.

Family: Strigidae

Genus: *Bubo*

Species: *B. scandiacus*

Snowy owls use their large wings to cruise low to the ground when hunting. They are fast hunters and snatch up their prey using the large, sharp talons, or claws, on their feet.
